Already 50 years have passed

Thus each historical age and place witnessed the birth of individuals who, faithful to themselves and to the call of their times, opened yet unexplored pathways and expressed God's tenderness in human ways. Fifty years ago, at the time of her death, the newspaper LA PATRIE, Montreal, published an article regarding the missionary zeal of Mother Délia and her young community. Respecting the language and thinking of the time, here is the translation of the entire text:

The Reverend MOTHER MARIE-DU-SAINT-ESPRIT, formerly Délia Tétreault of Marieville, Rouville County, foundress of the Missionary Sisters of the Immaculate Conception, went to her eternal reward on Wednesday evening at the age of 76 after 39 years of religious life. In 1902, she founded the first missionary community of Canadian origin at Côte-des-Neiges

in Montreal. By a privilege from Rome, she was appointed Superior General for life and she directed her Institute as such from its very beginnings to 1938. At this time, she was affected by a serious illness and after a period of five years, she was unable to fulfill her functions.

Canada loses in this humble but valiant woman, a brave apostle of far-

away missions and of all charitable works but it gathers from her holy life memories that will never fade away - the example of heroic virtues and works already largely blessed by God. An attempt is made here to show that the foundress of the Missionary Sisters of the Immaculate Conception fully realized her wonderful dream of conquering souls in non-christian countries.

Thanks to the zeal and especially to the clear vision of **Mother Marie-du-**

Saint-Esprit, the Institute came into existence on June 3, 1902, at Notre-Dame-des-Neiges, Montreal, under the benevolent patronage of His Excellency Mgr Paul Bruchesi and under the direction of Reverend Gustave Bourassa. On May 1, 1903, the newborn community moved to 27 Chemin Sainte-Catherine, Outremont.

On December 7, 1904, while in Rome to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the proclamation of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception, the Archbishop of Montreal submitted to His Holiness Pius X, the planned project:

"Carry on with the foundation, Mgr," replied the sovereign pontiff, "and all celestial blessings will descend upon the new Institute which you will name the Society of the Missionary Sisters of the Immaculate Conception."

As fields of action, all mission countries are open to the new apostles who have offered themselves wholeheartedly to the Church to work towards the building of the Kingdom of God. They were to plunge into their task without delay. It was in 1908 that they were called to their first apostolic mission in far-off China. On September 8 of the following year, 15 religious embarked on their long journey towards Canton.

As early as the first year, 1,500 dying children had been baptized. From July 1939 to July 1940, more than 5,000 children were gathered by the missionaries in Canton.

In fact, it was a usual sight to see on the doorstep of their home or along

the roadside, little ones crying, covered with rags or wrapped in a straw mat.

However, it was in 1913 that the outstanding apostolic work of the Missionary Sisters of the Immaculate Conception began: the Leprosarium of Shek Lung with its 800 patients. It was considered the largest institute of the kind throughout the world.

In 1938, since the Chinese Government had ceased to operate the asylum for the mentally sick in Fong Chuen, the Sisters accepted this difficult task of caring for these unfortunate people.

It would be impossible to enumerate the works that came to light in these non-christian countries as a result of the apostolic ideas which sprouted in the mind of the venerable foundress whom the Missionary Sisters of the Immaculate Conception mourn today.

It is thanks to the dispensaries organized by the missionaries that the non-christians were attracted to the true faith. Won over by the unselfish and loving care of the Sisters on their behalf, they were soon convinced of the truth of a religion which inspires such self-sacrifice and love for others.

The Missionary Sisters of the Immaculate Conception have 2 houses in Japan where they direct 2 kindergartens. The critical situation encountered by strangers in these far-away countries impedes their missionary action.

The farthest mission is that of Manila in the Philippines from which the Sisters were sent out. Summoned to leave the hospital within 48 hours,

they fulfilled their apostolic ministry to the end by preparing the non-christian patients for baptism.

The missionary life evidently requires a preparation. It is in the houses of Canada that the future apostles are trained and formed for their apostolate.

To Mother Marie-du-Saint-Esprit goes all the credit for the blossoming of all these undertakings. Her companions in religious life claim — she was humble, she was a saint. We do not hesitate to believe them for you can tell a tree by its fruit.

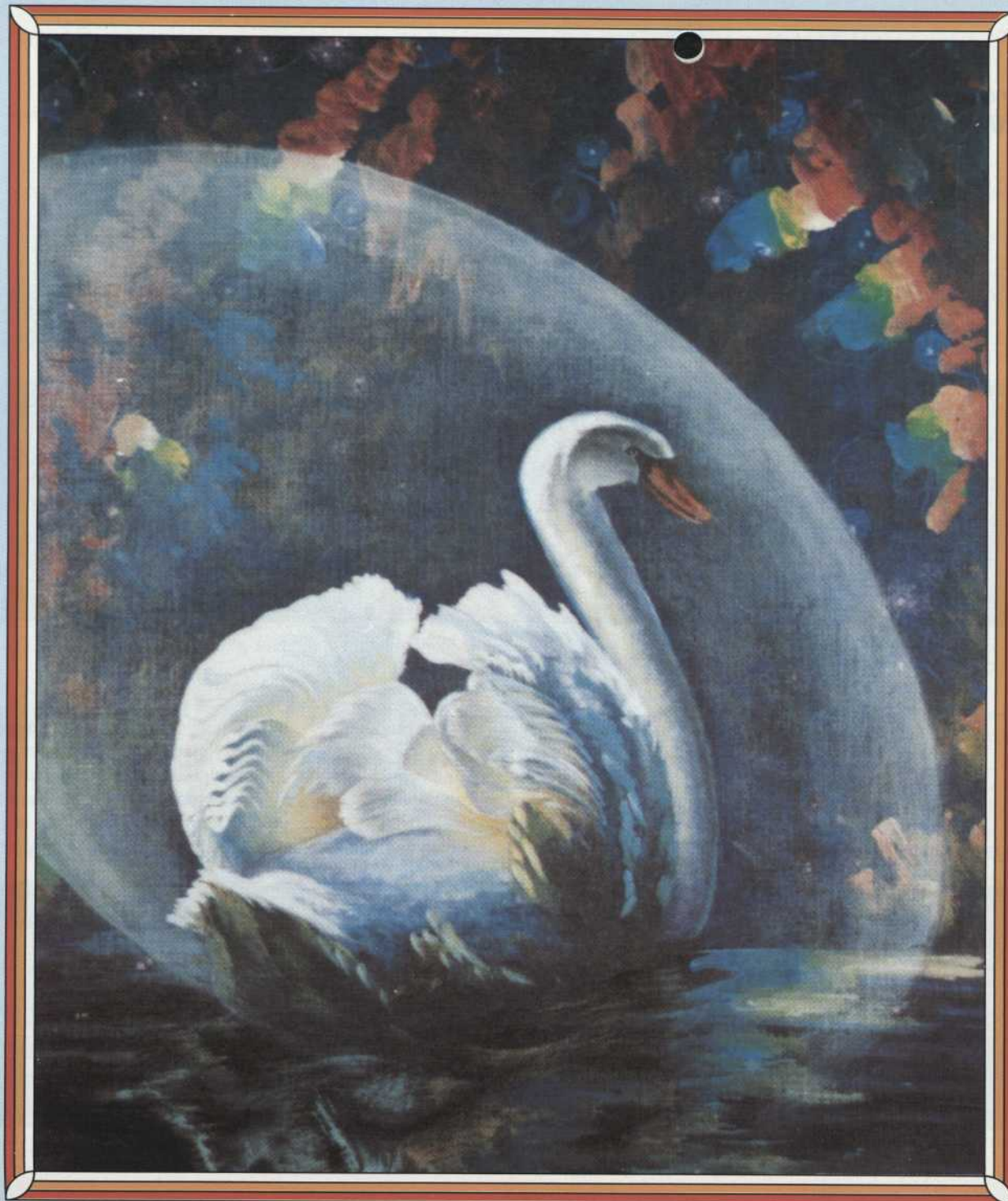
